JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 12.

Resolved by the assembly, the senate concurring, That section 1 of article 8 of the constitution of the state of Wisconsin be amended by adding at the end thereof the following: "Taxes may also be imposed on incomes, privileges and occupations, which taxes may be graduated and progressive, and reasonable exemptions may be provided," so that when so amended said section shall read as follows: "Section 1. The rule of taxation shall be uniform, and taxes shall be levied upon such property as the legislature shall prescribe. Taxes may also be imposed on incomes, privileges and occupations, which taxes may be graduated and progressive, and reasonable exemptions may be provided."

JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 13.

Providing for the appointment of a committee to investigate the advisability of the participation of the state of Wisconsin in the Jamestown Ter-Centennial Exposition, to be held on or near the waters of Hampton Roads, in the state of Virginia, in the year nineteen hundred and seven, in commemoration of the first permanent settlement made in the United States, by English speaking people, in the year sixteen hundred and seven, and to report the character and cost of said participation to the next session of the legislature.

WHEREAS, The United States by an act of Congress has determined it to be desirable to commemorate, in a fitting and appropriate manner, the birth of the American nation, the first permanent settlement of English speaking people on the American continent, made at Jamestown, Virginia, on the thirteenth day of May, in the year sixteen hundred and seven, in order that the great events of American history which have resulted
