JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 35.

To amend section 21 of article IV of the constitution, relating to the compensation of members of the legislature.

*Resolved by the assembly, the senate concurring,* That section 21 of article IV of the constitution be amended by striking out the word "five," being the twentieth word in the body thereof, and by inserting in lieu thereof the word "ten" so that the same when amended shall read as follows:

SECTION 21. Each member of the legislature shall receive for his services for and during a regular session the sum of ten hundred dollars, and ten cents for every mile he shall travel in going to and returning from the place of meeting of the legislature on the most usual route. In case of an extra session of the legislature, no additional compensation shall be allowed to any member thereof, either directly or indirectly, except for mileage, to be computed at the same rate as for a regular session. No stationery, newspapers, postage or other perquisites, except the salary and mileage above provided shall be received from the state by any member of the legislature for his services or in any other maner as such member.

JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 36.

Relating to greater harmony between state and national education.
