

Madison, and it shall be the duty of the officials having control of municipal and county buildings to furnish convenient offices and rooms for examinations, and necessary furniture, heat, and light for the accommodation of local examiners and registrars upon requisition by the commission. The commission shall be furnished by the state superintendent of public property with stationery, printing supplies, postage, and an official seal and other articles which it may require.

2. All salaries, expenses, and disbursements of the commissioners and their subordinates and employees shall be paid out of the state treasury, as the salary and expenses of other state officers are paid, and a sum sufficient to carry out the provisions of this act, not exceeding the sum of * * * *fifteen* thousand dollars per annum, is hereby appropriated, of which sum two thousand dollars is specifically set aside for the compensation of local examiners.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 437.

AN ACT to create section 976m of the statutes, relating to city, town, village, and county officers.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. There is added to the statutes a new section to read: Section 4549t. No officer or employee of the state village, or county board shall, during the term for which he is elected, be appointed or elected to any office or position which has been created by, or the election or appointment to which is vested in, such city council, or in such town, village, or county board.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
