Resolved by the assembly, the senate concurring, That the thanks of the legislature is hereby extended to the Madison Park and Pleasure Drive Association for their courtesy and on behalf of the people of Wisconsin for their active and effective interest in developing, perfecting and preserving, the great natural beauties of the Capital city of Wisconsin. It is through such worthy endeavor that the great beauties of nature throughout Wisconsin will be preserved.

JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 25.

Upon the public service and death of Michael Johnson.

WHEREAS, Michael Johnson, a member of this legislature for the sessions of 1874, 1875, 1876, and 1877, died at his home at Mt. Horeb, Dane County, on the tenth day of February, Nineteen Hundred and Eight, in the seventy-sixth year of his age; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Johnson's services to this state, in the legislature and as revenue collector and on the government survey, were of high character and the varied positions of public trust, which were for a quarter of a century in his keeping, always received his pains-taking consideration and were treated with the highest integrity throughout his long career; therefore, be it

Resolved by the senate and assembly in joint session assembled, That this expression of the sentiment of the legislature be incorporated with the official proceedings of the Senate and Assembly for this day, and that a suitably engrossed copy hereof, signed by the proper officers, be transmitted to the widow of the deceased.
