vided that none of the said officers shall receive any extra compensation for their services but may receive such traveling expenses and other expenses necessary to the fullest investigation of all of these matters.

JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 54.

To appropriate an additional \$9,000 to complete a Forest Products Laboratory at the University.

Whereas, Joint Resolution No. 71, S., has passed the Senate and Assembly, as follows: "That the Legislature approve the construction from the permanent improvement fund of the University, at an estimated cost of about \$41,000, of a forest products laboratory for work in forestry and for cooperation with the United States Forest Service."

WHEREAS, It is now found that the laboratory will cost about \$50,000, instead of \$41,000, therefore,

Resolved, That the Legislature approves taking \$9,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary, from the permanent improvement fund of the University in addition to the \$41,000 mentioned in joint resolution No. 71, S., for the purpose of completing such laboratory.

JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 55.

Providing an amendment to section 3 of article IV of the Constitution of the State of Wisconsin, relating to apportionment.

Whereas, At the biennial session of the legislature for the year 1907 an amendment to the Constitution of this State was proposed and agreed to by a majority of the members elected to each of the two houses, which proposed amendment was in the following language:

"Resolved by the senate, the assembly concurring, That section 3 of article IV of the Constitution of the State of Wisconsin be amended to read as follows:

"Section 3. At their first session after each enumeration made by the authority of the United States, the Legislature

shall apportion and district anew the members of the Senate and Assembly, according to the number of inhabitants, excluding Indians not taxed, soldiers, and officers of the United States Army and Navy."

Resolved by the senate, the assembly concurring. That the foregoing proposed amendment to the Constitution of the State of Wisconsin be and the same is agreed to by this legislature.

JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 56.

To provide for a joint committee of the legislature to investigate the subject of supervision and inspection of schools.

Resolved by the senate, the assembly concurring, That bill No. 720, A., go over until the special session of the legislature to be held in January, 1910, and that the same be referred to a joint committee of three senators and five assemblymen to be appointed in the same manner and under the same conditions as the other special committees; that to the same committee be also referred all other bills now before the legislature and relating to the supervision and inspection of schools; that the same committee is also empowered to investigate and report upon the advisability of reorganizing the educational system of the state and placing the state University, the normal schools, the high schools, and all other public schools, and the state superintendent's department under the general supervision of one board or commission; and that the governor be requested to include these subjects in the call for a special session.
