CHAPTER 198.

AN ACT to amend section 717 of the statutes, to enable the county board in certain counties to fix a sum of money, not exceeding fifty thousand dollars, that may be retained from the depository by the county treasurer.

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 717 of the statutes is amended to read: Section 717. Whenever any county board shall have designated a county depository in accordance with the provisions of section 693, it shall be the duty of the county treasurer, as soon as the bond required by that section has been approved and filed, to deposit as soon as received all funds that come to his hands in that capacity in excess of the sum he is authorized by such board to retain in such depository, and any sum so on deposit shall be deemed to be in the county treasury, and such treasurer shall not be liable for any loss thereon resulting from the failure or default of such depository without fault or neglect on his part. Every such depository shall on the first business day of each month, and oftener when required, file with the county clerk a statement of the amount of county money deposited with it during the preceding month, and the treasurer shall at the same time file with such clerk a statement showing the amount of moneys received and disbursed by him during the previous month. The county board may fix the amount of money which may be retained by the treasurer but in no case shall the sum exceed three thousand dollars; provided, that in all counties having a population of two hundred thousand inhabitants or over, *the treasurer may retain such sum as may be fixed by the county board, not exceeding fifty thousand dollars, and there shall not be less than two such depositories.*

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
