CHAPTER 238.

AN ACT to appropriate a certain sum of money to H. A. Huber, E. J. Kneen, S. C. Goff, A. R. Potts, Martin Gorecki, and G. E. Hoyt, to cover expenses incurred by the committee appointed by the governor, under the provisions of chapter 410 of the laws of 1909, to visit the state charitable and penal institutions.

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. There is hereby appropriated out of any moneys in the treasury not otherwise appropriated, to H. A. Huber, the sum of thirty-five dollars and two cents; to E. J. Kneen, the sum of forty dollars and eighty-five cents; to S. C. Goff. the sum of forty dollars and eighty-five cents; to A. R. Potts, the sum of forty dollars and eighty-five cents; to G. E. Hoyt, the sum of thirty-five dollars and two cents; and to Martin Gorecki, the sum of forty dollars and eighty-five cents, to cover and defray the actual expenses of the committee appointed by the governor under the provisions of chapter 410 of the laws of 1909, incurred during the ten days spent in visiting the state charitable and penal institutions.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage and publication.

CHAPTER 239.

AN ACT to amend subsection 1 of section 2374 of the statutes, relating to judgments in actions for divorce.

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Subsection 1 of section 2374 of the statutes is amended to read: (Section 2374) 1. When a judgment of divorce from the bonds of matrimony is granted in this state by a court, such judgment, so far as it determines the status of the parties, shall not be effective, except for the purpose of an appeal to review the same, until the expiration of one year from the date of the entry of such judgment, but such judgment may be entered as of the date when the court announces the decree of divorce.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
