CHAPTER 185.

AN ACT to amend section 4 of chapter 17, laws of 1853, relating to the state historical society.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 4 of chapter 17, laws of 1853 is amended to read: (Laws of 1853, chapter 17) 4. Said society may receive, hold, purchase and enjoy books, papers and other articles forming its library and collections to any extent, and may acquire and hold, and at pleasure alienate, any other personal and real estate, and may acquire the same by devise, or bequest, or otherwise, * * * but all its funds shall ever be faithfully appropriated to promote the objects of this formation.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage and publication.

CHAPTER 186.

AN ACT to create section 2577m of the statutes, relating to the establishment of Frances Willard Day.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. A new section is added to the statutes to read: Section 2577m. The twenty-eighth day of September in each year is set apart and designated as Frances Willard Day. In any year when the twenty-eighth day of September shall fall upon a day which is not a school day, the school day nearest such date shall be Frances Willard Day instead of the twenty-eighth day of September. On Frances Willard Day, approximately one and one-half hours may be devoted in the schools in this state for instruction and appropriate exercises relative to the life of Frances Willard and to the principles and ideals she fostered.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage and publication.
