CHAPTER 21.

AN ACT to amend paragraph (g) of subsection (7) of section 20.01 of the statutes, relating to the number of messengers for the senate.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Paragraph (g) of subsection (7) of section 20.01 of the statutes is amended to read: (20.01) (7) (g) * * * *Twelve* messengers, each two dollars and fifty cents per day.

CHAPTER 22.

AN ACT to appoint a committee to welcome Wisconsin soldiers and to create subsection (8) of section 20.02 of the statutes, and making an appropriation therefor.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. The governor is hereby authorized to appoint a committee, located in the city of New York, to represent the state of Wisconsin in welcoming and aiding Wisconsin soldiers as they return from oversea service.

SECTION 2. A new subsection is added to section 20.02 of the statutes to read: (20.02) (8) To the executive department not to exceed five thousand dollars for carrying out the purposes of

this act, said sum to be available for the renting of suitable quarters and other expenses incidental and necessary to welcome and aid Wisconsin soldiers returning from oversea service; these moneys to be expended only upon the approval of the governor.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect upon passage and publication.

CHAPTER 23.

AN ACT to amend subsection (4) of section 20.61 of the statutes, relating to the potato growers association, and making an appropriation.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Subsection (4) of section 20.61 of the statutes is amended to read: (20.61) (4) On July 1, * * * 1919, * * * four thousand dollars, and on July 1, * * * 1920, four thousand dollars to the Wisconsin potato growers association, for the promotion of the potato growing interests of the state; and any moneys paid into the general fund by said association are appropriated therefrom and added to this appropriation.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 1919.

CHAPTER 24.

AN ACT to amend subsection (1) of section 20.15 of the statutes, relating to memorial hall, and making an appropriation.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Subsection (1) of section 20.15 of the statutes is amended to read: (20.15) (1) To the custodian of memorial hall, annually, beginning July 1, * * * 1919, * * * one thousand eight hundred dollars, for the execution of the functions prescribed by sections 45.01 to 45.04. Of this there is allotted to the custodian an annual salary of twelve hundred dollars.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 1919.
