CHAPTER 332.

AN ACT to create section 561jk, and subsection (30) of section 20.17 of the statutes, relating to occupational therapy, and making an appropriation.

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. There is added to the statutes a new section to be numbered and to read: Section 561jk. The state board of control may give such instruction in occupational therapy at such institutions under its control as it shall deem wise; such instruction shall consist of vocational advice and technical training necessary for the proper qualifications of the inmates of such institutions for present and future usefulness.

Section 2. There is added to section 20.17 of the statutes a new subsection, to be numbered and to read: (20.17) (30) On July 1, 1919, five thousand dollars, to carry out the provisions of section 561jk. Of this there is allotted:

- (a) Not to exceed two thousand five hundred dollars, for salary and expenses of an instructor.
- (b) Two thousand five hundred dollars, to be used as a revolving appropriation for the purchase of the necessary materials and supplies.

Section 3. This act shall take effect upon passage and publication.

CHAPTER 333.

AN ACT to amend the third paragraph of subsection 2 of section 1494c of the statutes, relating to the sale of fertilizers.

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. The third paragraph of subsection 2 of section 1494c of the statutes is amended to read: (Section 1494c) (2) (Third paragraph) Approximate water content as used in this section is to be taken to mean within * * ten per cent. Neutralizing value is to be determined as follows: A determination of the carbon dioxide content is to be made directly on ground limestone, clam and oyster shells and marl.

Section 2. This act shall take effect upon passage and publication.
