CHAPTER 28.

AN ACT to amend section 158.01 of the statutes, relating to barbers.

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 158.01 of the statutes is amended to read: 158.01 Barbering is shaving, trimming the beard, cutting the hair, shampooing, scalp or face massage of a male * * for payment. Cutting, singeing, shampooing or dyeing hair, or scalp or face massage of any person for payment may be performed by a person licensed under either Chapter 158 or Chapter 159 of the statutes.

Section 2. This act shall take effect upon passage and publication.

CHAPTER 29.

AN ACT to amend subsection (1) of section 134.01 of the statutes, relating to trading stamps.

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. Subsection (1) of section 134.01 of the statutes is amended to read: (134.01) (1) No person, firm, corporation, or association within this state shall use, give, offer, issue, transfer, furnish, deliver, or cause or authorize to be furnished or delivered to any other person, firm, corporation, or association within this state, in connection with the sale of any goods, wares or merchandise, any trading stamp, token, ticket, bond, or other similar device, which shall entitle the purchaser receiving the same to procure any goods, wares, merchandise privilege, or thing of value in exchange for any such trading stamp, token, ticket, bond, or other similar device, except that any manufacturer, packer or dealer may issue any slip, ticket, or check with
