## CHAPTER 472.

AN ACT to amend subsection (4) of section 29.18 of the statutes, relating to close season for mink and muskrat.

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. Subsection (4) of section 29.18 of the statutes is amended to read: (29.18) (4) For mink and muskrat there shall be an open season from January first to April tenth, in all counties excepting the counties of Calumet, Fond du Lac, Green Lake, Marquette, Outagamie, Shawano, Waushara, Waupaca, Marathon, Lincoln, Forest, Florence, Oneida, Langlade, Marinette and Winnebago, where the open season shall be from October twenty-fifth to April first. There shall be no open season in Vernon, Crawford, \* \* \* Richland, \* \* \* Rock, Green, Monroe, Dodge, Barron, Lafayette, Kenosha, Dunn, Clark, Eau Claire, Polk, Racine, Wood, Chippewa, La Crosse, Bayfield, Pepin, Buffalo, Pierce, St. Croix, Marinette, Jackson, Dane, Lincoln, Burnett, Washburn, Oncida, Vilas, Iron, Forest, Florence, Ashland, Shawano, Langlade, Waukesha, Grant, Douglas, Sawyer, Rusk, Sauk, Iowa, Munitowoc, Sheboygan, and Taylor counties in odd numbered years, excepting land and lands and water in Freeman and Seneca townships in Crawford county, known as the Winneshiek bottoms owned by the United States government, where there shall be an open season each year for muskrat from January first to April tenth, and no close season for mink. The taking of muskrat and mink shall be under the joint supervision of the state conservation commission and the superintendent of the upper Mississippi river wild life and fish refuge.

Section 2. This act shall take effect upon passage and publication.
