20.246 The secretary of state shall on or before the thirtieth day of May, with the consent of the governor, transfer from time to time from the general fund to the public school fund income such sums as may be necessary to meet the allotments made from the public school fund income pursuant to section 20.245, but upon the collection of the income tax in such calendar year an amount equal to the sums so advanced shall be retained in the general fund.

CHAPTER 170.

AN ACT to create subsection (3) of section 40.17 of the statutes, relating to first aid kits in schools.

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. A new subsection is added to section 40.17 of the statutes to read: (40.17) (3) Every school board and the governing body of every private or parochial school shall provide a standard first aid kit for use in cases of emergency in every school in this state.

CHAPTER 171.

AN ACT to create subsection (33) of section 70.11 of the statutes, relating to property exempt from taxation.

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. A new subsection is added to section 70.11 of the statutes to read: (70.11) (33) Property owned and used exclusively for social and educational purposes and for meetings by any organization, corporation or association formed under the

laws of this state, whose members consist wholly of farmers; provided, no pecuniary profit results to any individual member.

CHAPTER 172.

AN ACT to amend subsection (3) of section 40.45 of the statutes, relating to training course for teachers in high schools.

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Subsection (3) of section 40.45 of the statutes is amended to read: (40.45) (3) Any person who shall complete such course of study, and who shall be of good moral character, shall receive a certificate, signed by the principal of such school and by the school board, setting forth that the person therein named has satisfactorily completed the course of study prescribed, and is of good moral character, and giving the standings secured by the person in each of the studies in the course. This course shall be open to nonresident students on the terms provided for nonresident attendance under the provisions of subsection (1) of section 41.46.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage and publication.
