CHAPTER 29.

AN ACT to create 20.41 (26) and 36.175 of the statutes, relating to free tuition for Wisconsin citizens taking university extension courses, and making an appropriation.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Subsection (26) of section 20.41 of the statutes is created to read:

(20.41) (26) EXTENSION COURSES FOR THOSE IN MILITARY SERVICE. On the effective date of this subsection a sum sufficient:

(a) To carry out the provisions of subsection (1) of section 36.175

(b) To refund tuition and instruction fees as provided in subsection (2) of section 36.175.

SECTION 2. Section 36.175 of the statutes is created to read: 36.175 EXTENSION COURSES FOR THOSE IN MILITARY SERVICE. (1) Any Wisconsin citizen serving in the army, navy or marine corps of the United States, upon proof of his military status, may take without cost correspondence courses from the extension division of the university of Wisconsin, but not more than one course may be taken at any one time. The necessary text books for such courses shall be provided by the student.

(2) All tuition or instruction fees paid by any such citizens who have enlisted or been inducted since October 14, 1940 shall have such tuition or instruction fees refunded.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect upon passage and publication.
