35.63 The legislature shall declare some newspaper published in Wisconsin to be the official state paper, in which shall be published all the laws, advertisements, proclamations, and communications of every nature which may now or hereafter be required to be officially published. Any such publication in such newspaper from any of the state departments shall be deemed official. Until a further designation is made the \* \* \* Wisconsin State Journal of Madison, Wisconsin, is declared to be the official state paper.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage and publication.

## CHAPTER 4.

AN ACT to create 20.74 (6) of the statutes, relating to special state aid to elementary and high schools which are in financial distress, and making an appropriation.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Subsection (6) of section 20.74 of the statutes is created to read:

(20.74) (6) On the effective date of this subsection, as a nonlapsible appropriation, \$200,000 as a special state aid to elementary and high schools which are in such financial distress that they cannot continue. This appropriation shall be distributed as aid to such schools at such times, in such amounts, and under such conditions as the board may determine to be necessary to adequately provide for the purposes for which this appropriation is made, with due regard for the whole amount available for such purposes. The necessary travel expenses of any person delegated by the board to investigate the needs of any such schools may be paid from this appropriation.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage and publication.
