

commission may require additional bond or security, when, in its opinion, the bonds then executed and approved are insufficient.

(4) Every such bond shall also include the following provisions, to wit: (a) In no event shall cancellation or any other termination of this bond be effective without surety giving in advance at least 10 days written notice by registered mail to the state banking commission of Wisconsin, and (b) the surety hereby agrees to furnish the state banking commission of Wisconsin at Madison, Wisconsin, a copy of all riders and endorsements executed subsequently to the effective date of this bond.

(5) Any violation of the provisions contained in subsections (1) and (2) shall subject the building and loan association to a fine of \$10 per day for each consecutive day of such violation and it shall be the duty of the attorney general to recover any such penalties by action for and in behalf of the state.

SECTION 2. 215.275, 215.28, 215.29 and 215.30 of the statutes are repealed.

CHAPTER 159.

AN ACT to amend 106.01 (1), (3), (4) (a) and (b) and (5) (b) and (c) of the statutes, relating to apprentices.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

106.01 (1), (3), (4) (a) and (b), and (5) (b) and (c) of the statutes are amended to read:

106.01 The term "apprentice" shall mean any * * * *person*, 16 years of age or over, who shall enter into any contract of service, express or implied, whereby he is to receive from or through his employer, in consideration for his services in whole or in part, instruction in any trade, craft or business.

(3) Any minor, 16 years of age or over, *or any adult*, may, by the execution of an indenture, bind himself as hereinafter provided for a term of service not less than one year.

(4) (a) By the * * * *apprentice*.

(b) *If the apprentice is a minor, also by the father; and if the*

father be dead or legally incapable of giving consent or has abandoned his family, then

(5) (b) The date of the birth of the * * * *person indentured*.

(c) A statement of the trade, craft or business which the * * * *apprentice* is to be taught, and the time at which the apprenticeship shall begin and end.

CHAPTER 160.

AN ACT to amend 104.08 (1) of the statutes, relating to apprentices.

104.08 (1) All * * * *persons* working in an occupation for which a living-wage has been established for minors, and who shall have no trade, shall, if employed in an occupation which is a trade industry, be indentured under the provisions of section 106.01.

AN ACT to create 343.329 of the statutes, relating to the misbranding of lubricating oils, lubricants and mixtures of lubricants, and providing a penalty.

343.329 MISBRANDING OF LUBRICATING OILS AND LUBRICANTS. Any person, firm, corporation or organization who or which makes for sale, or sells, or offers to sell or dispose of or has in his, her or its possession with intent to sell or dispose of any lubri-
