CHAPTER 503.

AN ACT relating to an oil portrait of former governor-elect O. S. Loomis, and making an appropriation.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

There is appropriated from the general fund, as a nonlapsible appropriation, not to exceed \$1,500 for the purchase of an oil portrait of former governor-elect, O. S. Loomis, and a frame therefor, under the supervision and direction of the governor. Such portrait shall be the property of the state and shall be hung in the executive office or some other suitable place in the capitol building.

CHAPTER 504.

AN ACT to renumber 111.06 (1) (c) to be 111.06 (1) (c) 1 and to create 111.06 (1) (c) 2 of the statutes, relating to unfair labor practices.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. 111.06 (1) (e) of the statutes is renumbered to be 111.06 (1) (e) 1.

Section 2. 111.06 (1) (c) 2 of the statutes is created to read: 111.06 (1) (c) 2. No petition by an employer for a referendum to determine whether an all union agreement is desired by his employer shall be entertained by the board where such employer has a contract or is negotiating for a contract with a labor organization which has been duly constituted as the bargaining representative of his employes unless such employer has made an agreement with such labor organization that he will make a contract for an all-union shop if it is determined as a result of the referendum held by the board that his employes duly approve such all-union shop.
