CHAPTER 131.

AN ACT to amend 20.16 (1) (g) and to renumber and amend 44.02 (7) of the statutes, relating to powers and duties of the state historical society, and making an appropriation.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. 20.16 (1) (g) of the statutes is amended to read: 20.16 (1) (g) All fines, fees or other money collected by said society shall be paid within one * * * month after receipt into the general fund and are appropriated therefrom to the state historical society as an additional appropriation to carry out its powers, duties and functions.

Section 2. 44.02 (7) of the statutes is renumbered 44.02 (4) and is amended to read:

44.02 (4) To keep its main library and museum rooms open at all reasonable hours on business days for the reception of the citizens of this state who may wish to visit the same, without fee * * *; except that the society may collect a fee for admission to historic sites or buildings acquired by the society elsewhere in the state, or for admission to defray the costs of special exhibits in its headquarters building or buildings of documents, objects or other materials not part of the society's regular collections but brought in on loans from other sources for such special exhibitions.

CHAPTER 132.

AN ACT to create 140.05 (13), 141.08 and 146.23 of the statutes, relating to epilepsy.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. 140.05 (13) of the statutes is created to read: 140.05 (13) The board shall report to the motor vehicle department the names, ages and addresses of all persons reported to it as epileptics.
