## CHAPTER 274.

AN ACT to amend 59.17 (3) of the statutes, relating to signing orders for the payment of money by the county clerk.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. 59.17 (3) of the statutes is amended to read:

59.17 (3) Sign all orders for the payment of money directed by the board to be issued, and keep in a book therefor a true and correct account thereof, and of the name of the person to whom each order is issued; but he shall in no case sign or issue any county order except upon a recorded vote or resolution of the board authorizing the same; nor shall he sign or issue any such order for the payment of the services of any justice of the peace, magistrate, clerk of court, district attorney or sheriff until the person claiming such order files an affidavit stating that he has paid into the county treasury all moneys due the county and collected or received by him in his official capacity; nor shall he sign or issue any order for the payment of money for any purpose in excess of the funds appropriated for such purpose unless first authorized by a resolution passed by the county board pursuant to section 65.90 (5).

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect January 2, 1950.
