

CHAPTER 405

AN ACT to amend 147.01 (1) (c), 147.03, 147.06 and 147.07 of the statutes, relating to the basic science board and the basic sciences and examinations therein.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follow:

SECTION 1. 147.01 (1) (c) of the statutes is amended to read:

147.01 (1) (c) The "basic sciences" are anatomy, physiology, pathology and *physical* diagnosis.

SECTION 2. 147.03 of the statutes is amended to read:

147.03 The governor, with the advice and consent of the senate, shall appoint the state board of examiners in the basic sciences. The board shall consist of 3 lay educators, none of whom shall be on the faculty of any department teaching methods of treating the sick. The term of office shall be 6 years. A vacancy shall be filled for the unexpired term. * * * The board shall within 30 days of appointment organize by the election of a president, secretary and treasurer. The compensation of the members of the board shall be \$10 for each day actually spent and actual and necessary expenses.

SECTION 3. 147.06 and 147.07 of the statutes are amended to read:

147.06 Examination shall be in the basic sciences only, shall be conducted not less than 4 times a year at such times and places as the board shall fix, and shall be both written and by demonstration or other practical test. No applicant shall be required to disclose the professional school he may have attended or what system of treating the sick he intends to pursue. *In lieu of its own examination, the board may accept, either in whole or in part, the certificate of the national board of medical examiners provided that certification by the national board is accepted by the state board of medical examiners in whole or in part and that such certification is accepted by the basic science boards of at least 6 other states.*

147.07 If the candidate attains a grade of 75 per cent in each subject, he shall receive a certificate in the basic sciences, signed by the president and secretary. If he fails in one subject only, he may be re-examined in that subject at any examination within one year without further examination fee. If he fails in 2 or more subjects he must apply anew and stand examination in all subjects. * * *
