CHAPTER 52.

AN ACT to amend 25.29 of the statutes, relating to depositing moneys in the conservation fund.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

25.29 of the statutes is amended to read:

25.29 All moneys, except fines, accruing to the state by reason of any provision of ch. 29, or otherwise received or collected by each and every person for or in behalf of the state conservation commission, if not payable into the forest reserve fund, shall constitute the "Conservation Fund" and shall be paid, within one week after receipt, into the state treasury and credited to said fund. *License fees collected by each field employe of the conservation commission shall be remitted to the commission within one month after receipt together with a report of the number of licenses issued and the amount of money remitted.* No money shall be expended or paid from the conservation fund except in pursuance of an appropriation by law; but any unappropriated surplus in said fund may be expended subject to the approval of the governor, secretary of state and state treasurer, for the purchase of lands for forestry purposes as provided in s. 28.02, for additional equipment, new buildings, new hatcheries, or hatchery ponds, property, improvements, increasing the warden force at any particular period, or any other similar special purpose except road work or improvement work on the state parks, provided, that funds accruing to the conservation fund from license fees paid by hunters and from sport and recreation fishing license fees shall not be diverted for any other purpose than those provided by the conservation department.
