CHAPTER 68.

AN ACT to repeal and recreate 29.41 of the statutes, relating to skins of fur-bearing animals.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

29.41 of the statutes is repealed and recreated to read:

29.41 SKINS OF FUR-BEARING ANIMALS. No person shall have in his possession or under his control the skin of any mink, muskrat, fisher, marten, beaver, or otter, showing that the same has been shot or speared, nor the green skin of any furbearing animal from the fifth day after the beginning of the closed season for such animal until the end thereof. No person shall have the raw skin of any muskrat, mink, beaver, otter, fisher, or marten in his possession at any time unless such person is the holder of a scientist's certificate, fur dealer's license, or trapper's license of current issue. No license shall be required of any person breeding, raising and producing domestic furbearing animals in captivity as defined in s. 29.579, nor of any person authorized to take muskrats on a cranberry marsh under a permit issued to him by the conservation commission.
