## CHAPTER 536

AN ACT to create 29.577 (3m) of the statutes, relating to otter, coon or skunk farm licenses.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

29.577 (3m) of the statutes is created to read:

29.577 (3m) Thereupon the commission shall appoint one man, the licensee shall appoint one man, and these 2 shall select a third man, said 3 men to act as a board to go upon the lands embraced within the license, and determine as near as possible the number of otter, raccoon or skunk thereon at the time of the granting of the license. The necessary expenses of all of the members of such board shall be paid by the licensee. Within 10 days after the date of such determination, the licensee shall pay to the conservation commission \$2.50 for each otter and \$1 for each raccoon and \$1 for each skunk so found on such lands. When such payment has been made the licensee shall become the owner of all of the otter, raccoon or skunk on said lands and of their offspring remaining thereon. He shall have the right to manage and control said lands and the otter, raccoon or skunk thereon, to take and trap the same at any time or in any manner which he sees fit and deems to the best advantage of his business, and to sell and transport at any time said otter, raccoon or skunk or the pelts taken from them.
