## CHAPTER 614

- AN ACT to amend 97.27 (2) of the statutes, as amended by chapter 10, laws of 1955, relating to regulating the sale of dried and frozen fruits.
- The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

97.27 (2) of the statutes, as amended by chapter 10, laws of 1955, is amended to read:

97.27 (2) This section shall not be construed to prohibit the sale of dietary foods containing saccharin in containers labeled in accordance with s. 97.60, nor shall this section prohibit the use of sulphur dioxide or sulphites as antioxidants in the processing of frozen apples provided such foods contain not more than 350 parts per million of  $So_2$ ; nor with the use of sulphur dioxide in molasses or in the processing of dried fruits in amounts no more than may be necessary in good manufacturing practice. Any person who refreezes or offers for sale any refrozen fruit containing sulphur dioxide or sulphites as antioxidants in not more than 350 parts per million, shall be punished as provided in s. 97.72 (2). The department may promulgate regulations limiting the quantity therein for any such dried fruit or molasses.
