CHAPTER 464

AN ACT to amend 57.078 of the statutes, relating to restoring of civil rights.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

57.078 of the statutes is amended to read:

57.078 Every person who is convicted of crime obtains a restoration of his civil rights by serving out his term of imprisonment or otherwise satisfying his sentence. The certificate of the department or other responsible supervising agency that a convicted person has served his sentence or otherwise satisfied the judgment against him is evidence of that fact and that he is restored to his civil rights. *Persons who served out their* terms of imprisonment or otherwise satisfied their sentences prior to August 14, 1947, are likewise restored to their civil rights from and after the effective date of this amendment (1959).
