CHAPTER 88

- AN ACT to amend 86.19 (4) and 86.191 (1) of the statutes, relating to highway signs and advertising in highways.
- The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:
 - 86.19 (4) and 86.191 (1) of the statutes are amended to read:
- 86.19 (4) This section shall not be construed as prohibiting the erection of such historical monuments or markers within the limits of public streets and highways as shall be approved by state highway commission. The name of a newspaper on a newspaper tube or receptacle shall not be deemed a sign within the meaning of this section.
- 86.191 (1) No person shall erect, or cause to be erected, any advertising, direction, guide, warning or other sign or marker within any public highway within a distance of 1,000 feet from the intersection of any 2 or more highways, when such intersection is beyond the corporate limits of any city or villages, unless permission is first obtained from the officials charged with the maintenance of such highways. The name of a newspaper on a newspaper tube or receptacle shall not be deemed to be any advertising, direction, guide, warning or other sign or marker within the meaning of this section.
