## CHAPTER 368

AN ACT to amend 60.12 of the statutes, relating to the calling of a special town meeting by the town board.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

60.12 of the statutes is amended to read:

60.12 Special town meetings may be held for the purpose of transacting any lawful business which might be done at the annual meeting, on a request being made to the town clerk in writing signed by 12 qualified voters of such town or by action of the town board, specifying \* \* \* the purposes for which such meeting is to be held. No matter voted upon or decided at any such special town meeting shall be acted upon in any subsequent special town meeting held in such town prior to the time for holding the next annual town meeting.
