CHAPTER 303

AN ACT to repeal and recreate 347.26 (6) of the statutes, relating to warning lamps on tow trucks and service vehicles.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. 347.26 (6) of the statutes is repealed and recreated to read:

347.26 (6) WARNING LAMPS ON TOW TRUCKS AND SERVICE VEHICLES. Any vehicle which by reason of its use upon a highway creates a vehicular traffic hazard requiring the exercise of unusual care in approaching, over-taking or passing shall be equipped with a flashing or rotating amber lamp of the dome type at the highest practicable point, visible from a distance of 500 feet, or 2 flashing amber lamps, one showing to the front and one showing to the rear, visible from a distance of 500 feet and mounted approximately midway between the extremities of the width of the vehicle and at the highest practicable point. Such lamps shall be lighted only when such vehicle is moving a disabled vehicle along or upon a highway or when such vehicle is standing on or near the traveled portion of a highway pre-paratory to towing or servicing the disabled vehicle.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect on January 1, 1966.
