CHAPTER 314

AN ACT to amend 347.26 (9) of the statutes, relating to warning lamps on motor vehicles of certain co-operatives.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

347.26 (9) of the statutes is amended to read:

347.26 (9) Any vehicle of a public utility as defined in s. 196.01 (1) or of a co-operative association organized under ch. 185 for the purpose of producing or furnishing heat, light, power or water to its members, which by reason of its use upon a highway creates a vehicular traffic hazard requiring the exercise of unusual care in approaching, overtaking or passing may be equipped with a flashing amber lamp of the dome type or with 2 flashing amber lamps, one showing to the front and one showing to the rear. Such lamps shall be mounted approximately midway between the extremities of the width of the vehicle and at the highest practicable point and shall be used only for the purpose of warning operators of other vehicles of the presence of the traffic hazard. Should such vehicle be of a type so as to make impractical the mounting of such lamps midway between the extremities of the width of the vehicle then such mountings shall be made at or near the upper left front and rear corners of such vehicle.
