

CHAPTER 364

AN ACT to repeal 22.01 (8) (d) (intro. par.); to renumber 22.01 (8) (d) 1 to 5 and 7; to renumber and amend 22.01 (8) (d) 6; and to create 22.01 (8) (d), (e) and (f) (intro. par.) of the statutes, relating to civil defense and organization for state-wide emergencies.

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. 22.01 (8) (d) (intro. par.) of the statutes is repealed.

SECTION 2. 22.01 (8) (d) 1 to 5 and 7 of the statutes are renumbered 22.01 (8) (f) 1 to 5 and 7, respectively.

SECTION 3. 22.01 (8) (d) 6 of the statutes is renumbered 22.01 (8) (f) 6 and amended to read:

22.01 (8) (f) 6. In case of a state of emergency proclaimed by the governor, direct the county civil defense activities and co-ordinate the municipal civil defense activities within the county, subject to the co-ordinating authority of the state director under sub. (5) and, in counties having a county executive, subject to par. (e);

SECTION 4. 22.01 (8) (d), (e) and (f) (intro. par.) of the statutes are created to read:

22.01 (8) (d) Shall, except in counties having a county executive, appoint a county civil defense director who shall be subject to the control and direction of the civil defense committee and the general supervision of the county board.

(e) Shall, in counties having a county executive under s. 59.031, designate such county executive or confirm his appointee as county civil defense director. Such civil defense director shall be subject to the control and direction of both the county executive and the county board if appointed by the county executive, or to the county board alone if he is the county executive; in either case, the county executive shall co-ordinate and direct, by executive order or otherwise, all administrative and management functions of the county civil defense program in accordance with s. 59.031. The civil defense committee shall retain the policy-making and rule-making powers in the establishment and development of the county civil defense program.
