CHAPTER 84, LAWS OF 1967

AN ACT to authorize the sale of certain state-owned land to the state historical society by the conservation commission.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

The conservation commission may sell lands within the following described area in the Kettle Moraine state forest to the state historical society at fair market value for the purpose of development of an outdoor museum:

The W- $\frac{3}{4}$ of Sec. 28, T. 5N., R. 17E.; and that part of the W $\frac{3}{4}$ of Sec. 21, T. 5N., R. 17E. located south of the south boundary of the Chicago, Milwaukee and Saint Paul railroad right of way, all in the Town of Eagle, Waukesha county, Wisconsin. Approved July 18, 1967.
