## CHAPTER 163, LAWS OF 1969

AN ACT to amend 29.09 (9) of the statutes, relating to disabled hunters.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

29.09 (9) of the statutes is amended to read:

29.09 (9) After proper application and presentation of a current hunting license duly issued to the applicant, the conservation director secretary may, after due investigation and without cost, grant a special permit to any person who is unable to walk because of any affliction whatsoever and requires a wheel chair or prosthetic appliance for mobility, to shoot or

hunt from a standing automobile or to leave decoys in the water in front of his own property unattended or to hunt any deer, whether a buck or a doe, during the regular deer season, notwithstanding any other provision of this chapter to the contrary. Regardless of deer hunting party permit limits, any holder of a permit under this section may obtain a party permit deer tag without cost upon application in any area for which a party deer season has been established.
