CHAPTER 327, LAWS OF 1969

AN ACT granting to Brown county a parcel of state-held land lying in the waters of Green Bay.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

All the right, title and interest of the state of Wisconsin in and to the following parcel of land, partly submerged, in Green Bay adjacent to the navigation channel improved by the United States and serving Green Bay harbor lying northeasterly from Grassy Island along and parallel to the improved navigation channel and between limits 250 and 2250 feet northwesterly therefrom, and extending from a southerly boundary at right angles to the channel direction at a point 8,688 feet northeasterly (along the improved channel) from a point in the channel abreast of the Murphy's Dock light at the mouth of the Fox River, 5,000 feet to a northerly boundary at right angles to the channel at a point 13,688 feet northeasterly from the said point in the channel abreast the Murphy's Dock light, containing a total area of 229.57 acres, is hereby granted and ceded by the state of Wisconsin to Brown county, Wisconsin, to be held and used by said county for public slips, basins, docks, wharves, structures, roads, shipping terminals, transportation facilities, recreation and park purposes.
