CHAPTER 140, Laws of 1971

AN ACT to create 343.17 (3) of the statutes, relating to anatomical gift notation on motor vehicle operator's license.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

343.17 (3) of the statutes is created to read:

- 343.17 (3) (a) The licensee may affix a decal on the front of the license to the right of the address, which indicates that the licensee is a potential donor of body organs or parts for the purposes of transplantation, therapy, medical research or education. The decal shall not conceal any of the contents required by subs. (1) and (2). Such decal shall be of a distinctive design and supplied to the donor by a nationally recognized organization which enlists donors of body organs or parts for the purpose of transplantation, therapy, medical research or education. The decal shall not be larger than one-half inch in diameter.
- (b) The use of the decal on the motor vehicle operator's license is proper or authorized only if the bearer has indicated his intent to make body organs or parts available for the above purposes by carrying a duly signed and witnessed donor card as authorized by the uniform anatomical gift act.
