## CHAPTER 28, Laws of 1973

- AN ACT to renumber 444.04 (2) and 444.16; and to create 444.04 (2) (a) and (c) and 444.16 (2) of the statutes, relating to sureties and license fee liability for showing boxing on closed circuit television.
- The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:
  - SECTION 1. 444.04 (2) of the statutes is renumbered 444.04 (2) (b).

SECTION 2. 444.04 (2) (a) and (c) of the statutes are created to read:

444.04 (2) (a) Every person wishing to hold or show any boxing match on any closed circuit telecast to be viewed in this state, whether originating within this state or another state, shall at least 7 days prior to such showing file a bond of \$1,000 of a good and sufficient surety with the state treasurer, conditioned for the payment of the tax hereafter imposed.

(c) The examining board may waive the bond required by par. (a) in cases where the applicant is a resident of this state or where the examining board is satisfied that the fee will be paid.

SECTION 3. 444.16 of the statutes is renumbered 444.16 (1).

SECTION 4. 444.16 (2) of the statutes is created to read:

444.16 (2) In addition to any other remedies, the several district attorneys or the attorney general are authorized to bring action in the name of the state to enjoin violations of this chapter or the rules of the examining board.
