1975 Senate Bill 431

CHAPTER 265, Laws of 1975

AN ACT to amend 158.04 (5) (e) of the statutes, relating to barbers sharing a waiting room with other commercial establishments.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

158.04 (5) (e) of the statutes is amended to read:

158.04 (5) (e) Interior doors leading to the barber shop from the employer's private living quarters shall at all times be closed and shall not be used by any one except by the employer barber, his employes or members of his immediate family if employed in the shop. Interior doors leading to any commercial place of business which may create a health, sanitary, safety or nuisance hazard if connected to a barber shop must remain closed and locked and shall be used only in cases of extreme emergency. The premises of the barber shop shall be well defined. The premises shall be capable of being separated from any commercial place of business and any interior doors leading to any other commercial place of business shall be capable of being closed. Nothing in this paragraph prohibits a barber shop and a beauty salon as defined in s. 159.01 (3) from utilizing a common waiting room.
