AN ACT authorizing and directing the department of natural resources to sell or exchange certain state lands in the county of Oneida.

CHAPTER 368, Laws of 1975

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. The department of natural resources is authorized and directed to sell or exchange at public or private sale for fair market value the following described parcel of land located in the county of Oneida which is deemed superfluous to state purposes:

An island in Hasbrook Lake located in the southeast quarter of the southeast quarter, section 27, township 39 north, range 7 east, also commonly known as Crescent Island.

SECTION 2. As an alternative to the procedure in SECTION 1 of this act, the department of natural resources may lease to Scott M. Brinkley and Jane R. Brinkley, Louisville, Kentucky, the parcel of land described in SECTION 1 of this act. The leasehold shall be held by the named lessees in joint tenancy with rights of survivorship. The term of the lease shall be year-to-year, renewable at the option of the lessees. The lessees may not transfer or assign their interests under the lease. The department of natural resources shall specify a just and reasonable rent to be paid by the lessees under the lease.
