## CHAPTER 7, Laws of 1975

- AN ACT to amend 158.10 (5); and to create 158.12 (5) of the statutes, relating to changing to 3 the number of apprentices permitted at a barbershop.
- The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. 158.10 (5) of the statutes is amended to read:

158.10 (5) No apprentice or journeyman barber shall practice barbering except under the immediate personal supervision and direction of a licensed shop manager and

cannot be the owner, manager, director or lessee of a barber shop or have any interest therein other than as an employe. Not more than one apprentice <u>3 apprentices</u> shall be employed by <u>at</u> any barber shop. Any barber shop employing more than one apprentice is classified and shall be advertised as a barber school. Each apprentice shall be assigned to a full-time licensed shop manager, but, no more than one apprentice shall be assigned to each full-time licensed shop manager.

SECTION 2. 158.12 (5) of the statutes is created to read:

158.12 (5) No shop manager shall employ or authorize employment of more than 3 apprentices in any one barber shop nor supervise more than one apprentice.
