CHAPTER 137, Laws of 1977

AN ACT to create 158.09 (5m) of the statutes, relating to training requirements for barber apprentice permit applicants.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. 158.09 (5m) of the statutes is created to read:

158.09 (5m) The examining board may grant credit to the apprentice permit applicant for related training and experience received prior to the date of registration. Credit may be granted toward completion of barber school and the apprenticeship requirements needed to qualify for the journeyman examination but may not exceed more than two-thirds of those requirements. The 5-year permit termination date shall be reduced by an amount equal to the credit granted to the applicant.

SECTION 2. Applicability. The barbers examining board may grant credit under section 158.09 (5m) of the statutes, as created by this act, to any person who is indentured as an apprentice or is attending an approved school or college teaching barbering, or a state penal institution offering barbering as a rehabilitation program, in this state on or after the effective date of this act.
