CHAPTER 188, Laws of 1977

AN ACT to create 86.19 (6) of the statutes, relating to highway signs.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. 86.19 (6) of the statutes is created to read:

86.19 (6) At the request of an incorporated city or village, the department shall erect directional signs on state trunk highways at the intersection of those highways with streets or other highways where the streets or other highways lead to the incorporated city or village, provided the city or village is located within 5 miles of the intersection and provided the city or village agrees to pay for the installation and maintenance of the sign. The directional sign shall show the name of the incorporated

city or village. For the purpose of this subsection, the term "intersection" includes exit ramps from any expressway or freeway or interstate highway.
