CHAPTER 218, Laws of 1977

AN ACT to amend 343.09 (1) of the statutes, relating to operators' licenses for persons having epilepsy.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

1105 CHAPTER 218

SECTION 1. 343.09 (1) of the statutes, as affected by chapter 29, laws of 1977, is amended to read:

343.09 (1) The department may issue a temporary license to any person afflicted with having epilepsy who has been free of seizures for 6 months prior to application for the license, or such lesser period of time as the secretary may determine is reasonable on the basis of medical evidence submitted by the applicant and who is otherwise qualified to obtain a license, provided such person the applicant submits to the department a certificate in the form prescribed in sub. (2). Unless sooner revoked, suspended or canceled, such license continues in force as long as the licensee presents to the department 6 months from the date of issuance of such license and at 6-month intervals for 2 years and yearly thereafter on the licensee's birth date a certificate in the form prescribed in sub. (2), except that in no event is such license valid beyond the date of expiration shown on the license. On such date, the license is subject to renewal.
