## CHAPTER **41**, Laws of 1977

AN ACT to repeal and recreate 343.06 (4) of the statutes, relating to requirements for alcoholics and persons addicted to controlled substances to meet to obtain motor vehicle operators' licenses.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. 343.06 (4) of the statutes is repealed and recreated to read:

343.06 (4) To any person whose dependence on alcohol has attained such a degree that it interferes with his or her physical or mental health or social or economic functioning, or who is addicted to the use of controlled substances as defined in s. 161.01 (4), except that the administrator may issue a license if the following conditions are fulfilled:

(a) The person submits to an examination, evaluation or treatment in a treatment facility meeting the standards prescribed in s. 51.45 (8) (a), as directed by the administrator, in accordance with s. 343.16 (2); and

(b) The person, if he or she has been institutionalized, exhibits a certificate of the attending physician, or superintendent of the institution to the effect that the person has been absolutely or conditionally released from the institution and the certificate includes a prognostic evaluation.
