1977 Senate Bill 28

CHAPTER 78, Laws of 1977

AN ACT to amend 121.77 (1) and 121.84 (title) and (1) (a) of the statutes, relating to permitting a school board to waive nonresident tuition for a pupil who was a resident of the school district at the beginning of the 2nd semester.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. 121.77 (1) of the statutes is amended to read:

121.77 (1) Every elementary school and high school shall be free to all persons of school age who reside in the school district. If facilities are adequate, a school board may admit nonresident pupils who meet the entrance requirements to the schools of the school district. Nonresident pupils shall have all the rights and privileges of resident pupils and shall be subject to the same rules and regulations as resident pupils. The school board shall charge tuition for each nonresident pupil, except a nonresident pupil having legal settlement, as defined in s. 49.10, in the school district.

SECTION 2. 121.84 (title) and (1) (a) of the statutes are amended to read:

121.84 (title) Tuition waiver; special cases; reorganized districts. (1) (a) The school board of a district operating high school grades may permit a pupil who is enrolled in a high school under its jurisdiction and is a resident of the school district at the beginning of the 2nd semester of the school year to complete the school year at the high school without payment of tuition, even though his or her parents move out of the school district before the close of the school year.
