## CHAPTER 284, Laws of 1979

AN ACT to create 176.05 (21) (h) of the statutes, relating to retail liquor licenses for restaurants of historical significance.

## CHAPTER 284

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. 176.05 (21) (h) of the statutes is created to read:

176.05 (21) (h) Notwithstanding this subsection, the governing body of any town, village or city may by a majority vote of its members grant a "Class B" retail intoxicating liquor license to any person who is engaged in preserving a place of historic significance built during the early populist period in Wisconsin (1886-1892) and operating such place as a restaurant on the effective date of this act (1979) and who submits an application for a license under this paragraph prior to January 1, 1981. A license issued under this paragraph does not affect the quota of any town, village or city under this subsection.
