## CHAPTER 182, Laws of 1981

- AN ACT to amend 15.105 (10) of the statutes, relating to staggering the terms of members of the board on aging and long-term care.
- The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. 15.105 (10) of the statutes, as created by chapter 20, laws of 1981, is amended to read:

15.105 (10) BOARD ON AGING AND LONG-TERM CARE. There is created a board on aging and long-term care, attached to the department of administration under s. 15.03. The board shall consist of 7 members appointed for staggered 5-year terms. Members shall have demonstrated a continuing interest in the problems of providing long-term care for the aged or disabled. At least 4 members shall be public members with no interest in or affiliation with any nursing home.

SECTION 2. Nonstatutory provisions; board on aging and long-term care. (1) The initial terms of the members of the board on aging and long-term care shall be as follows:

- (a) Three members shall be appointed for one-year terms.
- (b) One member shall be appointed for a 2-year term.
- (c) One member shall be appointed for a 3-year term.

- (d) One member shall be appointed for a 4-year term.
- (e) One member shall be appointed for a 5-year term.

(2) After the initial terms prescribed in subsection (1) expire, all subsequent appointments shall be for the terms specified in section 15.105 (10) of the statutes.
