CHAPTER 224, Laws of 1981

AN ACT to repeal and recreate 457.06 (3) and 458.06 (2) of the statutes; and to amend laws of 1979, chapter 292, section 18 (1), relating to licensing of barbers and cosmetologists.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. 457.06 (3) of the statutes, as affected by chapter 20, laws of 1981, is repealed and recreated to read:

457.06 (3) Examinations of applicants for master barber licenses shall consist of written tests and practical demonstrations requiring subjects to demonstrate minimum competency in services and subjects substantially related to public health and safety.

SECTION 2. 458.06 (2) of the statutes, as affected by chapter 20, laws of 1981, is repealed and recreated to read:

458.06 (2) The examination of applicants for manager's, operator's, manicurist's, instructor's and electrologist's licenses shall include tests requiring applicants to demonstrate minimum competency in services and subjects substantially related to public health and safety.

SECTION 3. Laws of 1979, chapter 292, section 18 (1) is amended to read:

(Laws of 1979, chapter 292) Section 18 (1) Any person who holds a journeyman's barber license issued under section 158.10 of the statutes on the effective date of this act may continue to engage in the practice of barbering in this state within the terms of the license for one year after the effective date of this act, regardless of the date of expiration of the license. Any person who holds held a journeyman's barber license on the effective date of this act May 14, 1980, may take any the master barber's examination administered by the examining board within one year after the effective date of this act on or after May 14, 1980, and until May 14, 1983. If, after one year from the effective date of this act May 14, 1983, a person holding a journeyman barber's license has not successfully completed the master barber's examination, the license held shall expire.
