CHAPTER 29, Laws of 1981

AN ACT to create 48.34 (11) and 53.185 of the statutes, relating to transferring a foreign juvenile delinquent or criminal to the foreign country upon request.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. 48.34 (11) of the statutes is created to read:

48.34 (11) TRANSFER TO FOREIGN COUNTRIES UNDER TREATY. If a treaty is in effect between the United States and a foreign country, allowing a child adjudged delinquent who is a citizen or national of the foreign country to transfer to the foreign country, the governor may commence a transfer of the child if the child and the child's parent, guardian, legal custodian or the court request.

SECTION 2. 53.185 of the statutes is created to read:

53.185 Transfer to foreign countries under treaty. If a treaty is in effect between the United States and a foreign country, allowing a convicted person who is a citizen or national of the foreign country to transfer to the foreign country, the governor may commence a transfer of the person if the person requests.

SECTION 3. Program responsibilities. In the list of program responsibilities for the office of the governor under section 14.011 (intro.) of the statutes, reference to sections "48.34 (11)" and "53.185" is inserted.
