1987 Wisconsin Act 257

AN ACT to create 46.925 of the statutes, relating to issuance of a decal or sticker to identify a motor vehicle owned or operated by a hearing-impaired person.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. 46.925 of the statutes is created to read:

46.925 Vehicle sticker for the hearing impaired. Upon the request of a person who is certified as hearing impaired by the department, by a licensed physician, by a licensed hearing aid dealer or fitter or by an audiologist certified by the American speech-language-hearing association, the department shall issue to the person a decal or sticker for display on a motor vehicle owned or frequently operated by the person to apprise law enforcement officers of the fact that the vehicle is owned or operated by a hearing-impaired person. No charge shall be made for issuance of the decal or sticker. The department shall specify the design of the decal or sticker. The decal or sticker shall be affixed by its own adhesive to the interior surface of the lower left-hand corner of the windshield of the vehicle.

SECTION 2. Terminology changes. Wherever the term "American speech and hearing association" appears in the following sections of the statutes, the term "American speech-language-hearing association" is substituted: 15.405 (6m) and 46.92 (2) (a).
