## 2001 WISCONSIN ACT 98

AN ACT *to renumber and amend* 120.13 (37); and *to create* 120.13 (37) (c) of the statutes; **relating to:** awarding high school diplomas to veterans.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

**SECTION 1.** 120.13 (37) of the statutes, as affected by 2001 Wisconsin Act 38, is renumbered 120.13 (37) (a) (intro.) and amended to read:

120.13 (37) (a) (intro.) Notwithstanding s. 118.33 (1), award a high school diploma to a person who is meets all of the following requirements:

- 1. Is at least 65 years old, attended.
- <u>2. Attended</u> high school in the school district, <u>left or</u> attended high school in this state and resides in the school district.
- 3. Left high school before receiving a high school diploma to join the U.S. armed forces during a war period

under s. 45.35 (5) (e), and served.

- <u>4. Served</u> on active duty under honorable conditions in the U.S. armed forces or in forces incorporated as part of the U.S. armed forces. <u>A school board may award</u>
- (b) Award a high school diploma to a person who received a high school equivalency diploma under s. 115.29 (4) after serving on active duty <u>under honorable conditions</u> if the person meets the <del>other</del> conditions of this subsection par. (a) 1. to 3.

**SECTION 2.** 120.13 (37) (c) of the statutes is created to read:

120.13 (37) (c) Award, upon request, a high school diploma to a person who has died, but who, before dying, satisfied the conditions of par. (a) 2. to 4.
