69.60 Registration of sour iron. rate

Ind 69.01 Scope. The fees fixed in this code shall be assessed and collected for the inspection of boilers, unfired pressure vessels, and refrigeration plants; for the examination and certification of boiler and elevator inspectors employed by insurance companies; for the examination and approval of building drawings and component parts of buildings; for the inspection of elevators, escalators, and dumbwaiters, and for all other services for which authority to fix and collect fees is provided in section 101.10 (12) and (13), Wis. Stats.

Ind 69.02 Boiler inspections. (1) For the purpose of determining the inspection fee, a boiler shall be rated at 10 square feet of heating surface per horsepower.

(2) Inspection fees shall be assessed and collected in accordance with this schedule:

(a) 3 H.P. and less	None	\$ 5.00	\$ 5.00
(b) 4 H.P. to 10 H.P.	\$10.00	10.00	5.00
(c) 11 H.P. to 25 H.P.	15.00	15.00	7.50
(d) 26 H.P. to 100 H.P.	20.00	20.00	10.00
(e) Over 100 H.P.	30.00	30.00	15.00

Ind 69.03 Unfired pressure vessel inspections. (1) For the purpose of determining the inspection fee, the size of an unfired pressure vessel shall be its cubic content in terms of cubic feet.

(2) Inspection fees shall be assessed and collected in accordance with this schedule:

Volume In Cubic Feet	Internal Inspection	Hydrostatic Test	External Inspection
(a) 1 to 50	\$ 5.00	\$ 5.00	\$1.00
(b) 51 to 200	7.50	7.50	2.00
(c) Over 200	10.00	10.00	3.00

(3) The minimum fee to be assessed and collected shall be \$3.00 per plant.

Ind 69.04 Refrigeration plant inspections. (1) For the purpose of assessing the inspection fee, the capacity of a refrigeration plant shall be determined in tons. One ton of refrigeration capacity shall be the equivalent of abstracting heat at the rate of 12,000 Btu per hour.

(2) Inspection fees shall be assessed and collected in accordance with this schedule:

Capacity in Tons	Inspection Fee
Less than 3 -----	Exempt
3 to 25 -----	\$ 5.00
26 to 100 -----	7.50
101 to 250 -----	10.00
251 to 500 -----	15.00
Over 500 -----	20.00

Ind 69.10 Building plan examinations and approvals. (1) Drawings, design computations, and specifications shall be submitted for all projects in compliance with the applicable administrative codes and shall be accompanied by a fee in the correct amount determined in accordance with the schedule shown in section Ind 69.10 (3).

(2) For the purpose of arriving at the examination and approval fee for building plans and for heating and ventilation plans, the size of a building shall be the total cubical volume determined by the overall outside dimensions of length, width, and height.

(3) Plan examination and approval fees for the listed types of construction shall be assessed and collected as follows:

- (a) General building drawings-- 20¢ per 1,000 cubic feet
Minimum Fee—\$10.00 per plan
- (b) Heating and ventilation drawings ----- 10¢ per 1,000 cubic feet
Minimum Fee—\$5.00 per plan
- (c) Miscellaneous drawings:
 1. Stadia, grandstands and bleachers ----- \$5.00 per 1,000 seats or fraction of 1,000 seats
 2. Structures, when submitted separately from general building drawings \$10.00 per structure
 3. Fire escapes—drawings submitted by fabricator-- \$5.00 per fire escape
 4. Industrial exhaust systems for dusts, fumes, vapors, gases, and spray coating ----- \$5.00 per system
 5. Alterations and repairs for buildings and structures ----- \$1.00 for every \$1,000 or fraction of \$1,000 estimated cost.
Minimum Fee—\$5.00. (Estimate need not include costs of razing, plumbing, electrical, painting, or decorating.)

Ind 69.20 Elevators, escalators, and dumbwaiters—plan examination and approvals. (1) Drawings for elevators, escalators, and power dumbwaiters shall be submitted for all projects in compliance with the provisions of section Ind 4.04, Wisconsin Administrative Code (Elevators).

(2) The plan examination and approval fee for projects listed in this section, Ind 69.20 (2), shall be assessed and collected as follows:

- (a) Elevators ----- 1/10 of 1% of Cost
Minimum Fee—\$10.00
- (b) Escalators ----- 1/10 of 1% of Cost
Minimum Fee—\$10.00
- (c) Dumbwaiters ----- 1/10 of 1% of Cost
Minimum Fee—\$10.00

Ind 69.25 Elevators, escalators, and dumbwaiters—inspections. (1) For the purpose of determining the inspection fee, elevators, escalators and dumbwaiters shall be classified in one of the categories listed in section Ind 69.20 (2).

- (2) Inspection fees shall be assessed and collected as follows:
- (a) Class I—Freight elevators. (Single belt, double belt, cable control, sidewalk elevators, sidewalk type elevators, and grade level elevators) ----- \$15.00
 - (b) Class II—All other freight elevators not in Class I ----- 10.00
 - (c) Class III—Passenger elevators having a travel of 1 floor only ----- 8.00
 - (d) Class IV—Passenger elevators having a travel of 2 but not more than 3 floors ----- 10.00
 - (e) Class V—Passenger elevators having a travel of 4 or more floors ----- 15.00
 - (f) Class VI—Escalators per unit ----- 15.00
 - 1. An escalator unit shall mean a single section of moving stairway having a travel of 1 floor.
 - (g) Class VII—Power dumbwaiters ----- 6.00
 - (h) Class VIII—Hand power dumbwaiters ----- 6.00

Ind 69.30 Shop inspections. (1) Inspections of boilers, pressure vessels, and similar fabricated items may be provided at reasonable times by the commission at the place of manufacture on request, but only when deemed by the commission to be essential and necessary.

(2) Fees to be assessed and collected for shop inspections shall be as follows:

- (a) One inspector's services ----- \$60.00 per 8-hour day
 - 1. Additional charges shall be assessed and collected for necessary expenses incurred by the inspector for travel including mileage, meals, and lodging. Travel expenses shall be limited to those allowable under commission employe travel regulations.

INDUSTRIAL COMMISSION

Ind 69.50 Certificates of competency. (1) Insurance company employees eligible in accordance with the provisions of the applicable administrative code, to be examined for competency as a boiler inspector or as an elevator inspector shall submit with the proper application forms an examination fee of \$25.00.

(a) An applicant who fails the scheduled examination may apply for re-examination, but no additional examination application fee shall apply provided the application is filed within 12 months from the date of the first examination.

(2) The commission may renew certificates of competency on an annual basis. The annual renewal fee shall be \$5.00.

Ind 69.60 Registration of sources of ionizing radiation. The fee to be levied on every operator registering under section 101.50 (7), Wis. Stats., shall be \$5.
